
Wirral Foodbank providing Emergency food for local people in crisis

Foodbank use continues to rise across the UK

Trussell Trust has announced that in 2016-17 the Foodbank Network provided 1,182,954 three-day emergency food supplies to people in crisis compared to 1,109,309 in 2015-16. Of this number, 436,938 went to children.

The North West shows the highest number of people accessing foodbanks, with three-day emergency food supplied to people in crisis.



Merseyside was the highest in the North West, with 61,324 emergency food supplies provided. Wirral Foodbank provided over 11,978 three-day emergency food supplies to local people in crisis. Of this number, 4,072 went to children. The top three reasons for foodbank referral were benefit delay 27%; low income 26% and benefit change 20%.

Wirral is currently part of the Universal Credit pilot. Universal Credit is the new single benefit payment, replacing income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA), Housing Benefit, Working Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) and Income Support. It is understood that the full service will be in place across the whole of the Wirral by November 2017. New claimants will have to wait a minimum of 6 weeks for their first payment; this delay could contribute to debt, rent arrears etc. The introduction, so close to Christmas, will have an adverse impact on many people. Wirral Foodbank is already planning for the full roll out of Universal Credit and the potential pressure this will inevitably have on the service we provide.
