News from Trussell Trust



In the last financial year, food banks in the Trussell Trust network have seen the highest ever level of need, distributing close to 3 million (2,986,203) emergency food parcels — including more than a million to children. This is the most parcels the network has ever distributed in a single year. Find out more from The Trussell Trust

Emergency food is not the solution to food poverty

The cost-of-living crisis is affecting us all. Trussell Trust has reported that 90% of low-income households receiving Universal Credit are going without at least one essential like food, a warm home, or toiletries.

We believe strongly that emergency food is not the solution to food poverty. In 2018 Wirral Foodbank and Citizens Advice Wirral joined forces and set up Foodbank Plus, a project funded by Wirral Foodbank and delivered by Citizens Advice Wirral. Foodbank Plus seeks to address the underlying reasons of food poverty. Between January - March 2023, Foodbank Plus supported 839 people and delivered £68,000 in financial support, include debt write-off, unclaimed benefits, and supply of white goods,

Trussell Trust have launched a new campaign, "Guarantee our Essentials", in partnership with the Joseph Rowntree Foundation (JRF), calling on the UK government to enshrine in law the amount people need to ensure the basic rate of Universal Credit at least covers the essentials.

Behind the numbers are individuals. Let's hear of someone who came to Wirral Foodbank and received "more than food."

Anna (*) attended Wirral Foodbank. In addition to requiring emergency food, she needed help in applying for Personal Independence Payment (PIP). Following a conversation with a volunteer she was referred to Foodbank Plus, who completed a PIP application. As part of an overall benefit check, an application was also made for Severe Disability Premium. applications were successful, resulting in an additional £150 per week, plus £3,380 in backdated benefit payments. Anna said that she was "over the moon" with the outcome, and thanked us for our help and advice, which had left her in a better financial situation, and feeling less anxious about the future.
